# Assessment

## Classroom-based

Junior Cycle French (Common Level) involves two classroom-based assessments (CBAs), an Assessment Task (AT) based on CBA2 (which accounts for 10% of the mark in French) and a final written exam.


On completion of this subject, Coola students can:

## **Course Content**

French for Leaving Certificate builds on the knowledge gained at Junior Cycle. The aim is to improve students' skills in reading comprehension, aural comprehension, written and oral work. There is a greater emphasis on oral work, as one of the components of the Leaving Certificate is an oral test accounting for 25% of the total marks. Course content for Higher and Ordinary levels is similar. However, oral and written skills are of particular importance at Higher level.
